Praise God we are turning the corner on this pandemic! Let us continue to pray that we will soon be free from communal restrictions.

We thank all who continue to resiliently participate in Community activities. Without you, there is no Fourth Day!

The Secretariat approved revised guidance for discerning Rector/a, and Team selection. A Rector/a Selection Committee was formed and this spring, followed the process for identifying potential Rector/as for the coming years.

A Nominating Committee is in the developmental stages. This committee, consisting of Secretariat and non-Secretariat members, will discern and approach Cursillistas as partners for the Precursillo, Cursillo, and Postcursillo committees.

This spring, the Albany Cursillo Movement was well represented at the Region 1 (New England/Eastern NY) Spring Encounter! Nine Cursillistas attended the Zoom Encounter – more than half were not Secretariat members! We are encouraged to see so many show an interest in the broader Cursillo community. In addition to an Ultreya, and praying the Rosary, we listened to three lay rollos and one spiritual rollo and participated in small group discussions. Region One holds an Encounter each Spring and Fall. All Cursillistas are welcome and encouraged to attend. We hope to see you at the Fall Encounter!

As you can see on the calendar in this edition of the Little Light, we are not letting the pandemic stop us from planning events. At this point, most of the activities will be held via Zoom. If you do not feel comfortable with Zoom, there is a phone number you can use to call in for participating.

We invite you to print the calendar and post it on your refrigerator; or for those of you who are more

tech savvy, transfer the information into your phone. Of course, as event dates approach, we will continue to send email reminders and invitations. Please do share this information with any Cursillista you may know who does not receive email.

Make a Friend...

Sr. Betsy developed an aid to help you identify friends in your different environments as potential candidates for living a Cursillo Weekend.

In the near future, the sheet will be added to the new website, under the "Albany Cursillo Resources" tab. You can then download and fill in the sheet with new names in each season of your life.

In the meantime, below is a list of the different environments where you likely make friends, are friends, and share the love of Christ with those friends.

Simply write out these categories and make a list of the people you know under each category who might be ready to live a Cursillo Weekend.

Awareness is the first step!

- Relatives and Friends
- Friends from previous jobs
- Church and Social contacts (i.e., clubs, bowling)
- Civic Groups, Committees, Scouting, Choir and other parish contacts
- People you see, but haven't spoken with in church
- Co-Workers

Please pray over your list of names and ask God to help you discern which individuals you might consider sponsoring. (Keep in mind that you should only sponsor a max of two people on a Weekend.)

The first Cursillo Weekend was conducted in 1944 in Mallorca, Spain, where the Step By Step process continues to be used today.

As the Cursillo Movement grew and expanded worldwide, various adjustments were made that altered how the Weekends were conducted. Specifically, modifications were made that added activities and/or processes that the founder, Eduardo Bonnin called, "Christmas tree ornaments." Basically, these are pretty baubles that distract from the simple intent and message presented on the Weekend.

Eduardo understood these adaptations and adjustments were done with the best of intentions; yet the adjustments caused the Weekend to diverge from its authentic roots.

In his book, **My Spiritual Testament**, Eduardo called for the Weekends to return to the original format (copies of this book are available for the price of \$5.00, contact Joe Fitzgerald). Thus began the international effort to reinstate Eduardo's Step By Step Method in places where it had been altered.

Fortunately, the Albany Cursillo Movement did not adopt too many changes! So, to revert fully back to the Step By Step format should not be too "painful." From Winter 2020 through Fall 2020, the School of Leaders provided basic information and background on the Step By Step Method for the Cursillo Weekends.

This culminated in the Region 1 Service Team providing the formal training to the Cursillistas, both those on the Weekend Teams as well as to all other interested Cursillistas, via Zoom, on May 22nd and June 12th.

If serving on a Weekend Team interests you, please attend future School of Leaders meetings and the future Step By Step training.

HAVE YOU SEARCHED YOUR ENVIRONMENTS FOR FRIENDS WHO MIGHT BENEFIT FROM LIVING A CURSILLO WEEKEND?

Some of you may have had the opportunity to attend the presentation on Cursillo sponsors.

This year we are emphasizing a few things to ensure candidates are more engaged in the Cursillo Movement from their lived Weekend and into their 4th Day.

- The sponsor will receive a booklet with guidelines for a sponsor. And they are also given a book for the new Cursillista called "The Cursillo Movement, What is it?" Please note that it is important for both persons to read their booklet.
- 2. The Cursillo community prepares for the new Cursillistas not the other way around. We Cursillistas should be aware of what Precursillo, Cursillo, and Postcursillo are about. God's love in ourselves and with our fellow community should be prevalent so that we will be better prepared to share that love with others during their Weekend and throughout their fourth day!
- Sponsors are asked to bring new Cursillistas to Ultreya and introduce them to small grouping prior to the weekend, so that they learn more about the 4th Day and get to know members of our community.
- 4. Pray as you search your environments and pray about bringing someone to Christ, or closer to, Christ. This might not mean the person will live a Cursillo Weekend right away, but it will plant the seed for another time.

OTHER IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THIS YEAR:

This year, the Men's Weekend is August 26-29th and

The Women's Weekend is September 30th - October 3rd.

To facilitate a meaningful experience for the candidates, a minimum of six candidates is necessary for each Weekend. We pray there will be many more!

The candidate cost for the weekend is \$205.

As you read this, we have received confirmation the facility can host the Weekends. We are awaiting news of any restrictions or procedures that may be required.

Cursillo Opportunities in a COVID World:

Zoom and Information Nights

During Covid, we've been innovative with technology in our family, educational, work, and religious lives. We've adapted.

So has Cursillo with the help of Zoom. Instead of in person invitational nights this year, we are going to try doing a few Zoom meetings.

The point of the Zoom meeting will be to have Cursillistas share their experience with potential candidates in a group setting. This means two things:

- 1. We will need Cursillistas to talk about our experiences and
- 2. We will need potential candidates.

The plan is to have two events. For the first one, we would like to have candidates who are leaning strongly toward attending a weekend. We hope that the sponsors will support these prospective candidates by attending with them. The date for this will be June 30th at 7 p.m.

The other event will be on July 12th, at 7 p.m. and it will be an open event for people who may be interested or know nothing about Cursillo.

For both events, we need the help of other Cursillistas, not just the potential sponsors.

POSTCURSILLO

Despite Covid restrictions, we have continued to conduct friendship groupings, Ultreyas and other activities.

Last summer, we met outside for groupings and smaller Ultreyas. Since then, we have utilized Zoom for all meetings and other activities.

Ultreya attendance has increased due to the lack of need for travel and the ability of those who live farther away, even in other states, to join us.

On January 20, our Annual Workshop was conducted via Zoom. The Workshop focused on the Year of Saint Joseph.

Joe Thouin spoke about his family member's healing at St. Joseph's Oratory in Montreal. His family has a great devotion to St. Joseph.

I discussed Fr. Donald Calloway's book, Consecration to St. Joseph.

The book contains information, short readings, and prayers for each of the thirty-three days. These are followed by a variety of Acts of Consecration from which to choose, on the last day.

I shared many details from the book, about the life of St. Joseph and the miracles attributed to him. I also shared the many titles given to St. Joseph, in the Litany.

The author addressed many questions such as St. Joseph's age, whether he was a widower, and if he had children before marrying Mary, and whether he and Mary had other children.

Thirty people attended the presentation. A transcript of the presentations from this Workshop is available. Please contact me if you would like a copy of the transcript.



We have Teams at the ready.


But we presently need women and men to be befriended and invited.

The Albany Diocese Cursillo Movement will now begin implementation of the Step By Step Weekend process. The Weekend Teams for 2021 are incorporating as much of the Step By Step process as is comfortable to them. All subsequent Weekends will fully implement the process within the parameters of our individual local capacities. Training in Step By Step will be necessary for all future Team Members; this training will be conducted by the School of Leaders.

During 2021, the School will meet, via ZOOM, on Saturday mornings from 10 a.m. – 12 p.m. We will revisit the possibility of in-person meetings prior to the first session in 2022. The School of Leaders meeting dates are:




