Below is a list of the different environments where you may identify individuals you believe would benefit from living a Cursillo Weekend.

Nominating Committee

- Some of the far aways will be those who never have known Jesus. Some have just gotten out of the habit of prayer and church.

In the past we have thought of evangelization as standing on a soap box, yet friendship is the best form of evangelization.


Spiritual Advisors' Corner, cont.

SCHOOL OF LEADERS

This past year the School of Leaders continued to focus on preparing the community for the "Step By Step" Cursillo Weekend process. "Step By Step" is the original Weekend method (still used in Mallorca), developed by the Movement's founder, Eduardo Bonnin. The School of Leaders hosted the Cursillo Region 1 Step by Step Rector Guide Training on May 22 and June 12, 2021, via ZOOM, to prepare for the Weekends in 2021.

In Eduardo's book, **My Spiritual Testament**, he requested the Cursillo Movement throughout the world conduct Weekends based on the original method. He considered this book his Last Will and Testament to the Cursillo Community.

Zoom is the gathering space for this School of Leaders year, September 2021 - March 2022. Four meetings have taken place. The remaining two meetings are scheduled for Feb 19, and Mar 19. The theme this year is "The Cursillo Charism", with readings and discussions concerning the books, Eduardo Bonnin: An Apprentice Christian and History of a Charism.

We were most pleased to welcome **Gail Terrano** as our **Guest Speaker on Nov 13**, along with Cef Aguillon, Cursillo National English Coordinator, and Cursillistas from around the Country, who joined us for this presentation! Gail (and Cef) had met Eduardo Bonnin, while serving on the World-wide Cursillo Secretariat (OMCC). Gail has served as a translator / editor of many of his final writings.

Precursillo

The readings from the second Sunday of Advent inspired my contribution to the Little Light...

Today's world needs HOPE. There is a great deal of separation whether it be in our family, our community, our church, our country, or our world.

Baruch's words were intended to unite God's people so that they could be led by God. How can you and I unite others in our environments so that God can lead us and work through us?

> We can search our environments as Eduardo Bonin taught us.

We need to pray for God to strengthen our world to bring together those who believe in his love to show the world how wonderful HE can be. From *Mentality, Cursillo in Christianity,* "These individuals are fervent souls that anxiously await to be called; show your impatient yearning of the vast field to be harvested, there are somnolent ones who need to be awakened; others who are faint-hearted (inhibited, timid) who will need to be encouraged; and the disoriented ones who need to be guided."

These "far away" linked with Christian leaders, in our community, can be molded to work more effectively spreading the Good News of the Lord to the world.

St. Paul taught by example that a Christian behaves in a certain way and that even in times of difficultly, that way is to LOVE.

Like St. Paul, we can teach people in our lives about Christ. How can we do this effectively? By focusing on what we have in common: the Holy Trinity, the Sacraments, our Catholic faith, loving one another as God has loved us, Cursillo, Fourth Day, and so much more.

But more importantly how can we teach others God's Love? By making a friend, being a friend, and bringing a friend to Christ. Easier said than done, isn't it? But it is possible when we show them through Christian action. Anthon St. Maarten said, "Actions prove who someone is; words just prove who they want to be." We cannot talk about Christ unless we act like Christ.

John the Baptist's voice announces God is coming to forgive. So how does this fit into Precursillo?

Precarsillo cont.

Consider forgiveness as an ability to begin again. From a Precursillo perspective, you can think of forgiveness every step of the way with a Cursillista.

In the Precursillo, you can make a friend, and be a friend, but bringing that friend to Christ (not to a Cursillo Weekend) may take more time. You may need to begin again many times. In fact, you may never know during the season you are most connected with this person, that your efforts are bearing fruit. But take heart, your efforts to show and teach God's love are definitely planting seeds.

, but you can always begin again just like in life. While you are making a friend and bringing them to Christ the intent isn't having them make a weekend, it is about planting the "seed" in their life. How that seed grows is between them and God.

A Cursillista's path in the Fourth Day is their own experience. (With a little nudging from our sponsor.) We can choose to participate in everything or nothing. However, the fourth day door is ALWAYS open. Make a new beginning... begin grouping or attending Ultreya again. WE ARE FRIENDS! Forgiveness is all of ours to experience.

So, I challenge you. Start now! Make friends, be a friend, and bring those friends to Christ. Step back and look at your environment. Where do you see a call to unite? Where is there a need for LOVE and how can you teach/show it? And where is there an opportunity to begin again? Where does your opportunity lie?

Another challenge... while you are working toward making friends and bringing them closer to Christ, keep your mind's eye open for those individuals you know who would benefit from living a Cursillo Weekend.

It is critical to begin preparing Candidates for living the Weekends in 2022. Please identify candidates and get applications in by May 1st. I ask you identify three people and speak with each of them about Cursillo. Share what Cursillo has meant to you. Invite them to attend Ultreyas with you.

Good accountability involved here! If you can respond to this question about your 4th Day, "I am doing well!"

Or, if the closing to a note causes you to think, "I will keep up the good work!"

Even if you recognize the closing as a challenge, "Get Busy!"

You are the perfect witness at an Ultreya!

Your story could very well be the exact encouragement for those attending the Ultreya, whether it be a story of success or challenges.

Christ is counting on you and so are we!!

Leaders' Manual excerpts...

During this time of seeking those who are willing to take on the task of ensuring the Albany Diocese Cursillo Movement remains strong and vibrant, we share the following excerpts from the Leaders' Manual...

Two purposes of the Movement:

1. "It is a means for living what is fundamental for being Christian (3-fold love of God, love of oneself, and love of one's neighbor), which is experienced through three essential encounters (self, God, others), immediate purpose – 'Salt of the earth."

2. "That the person be ferment in order to vertebrae (give backbone to) Christianity in society and live what is fundamental for being Christian in their environments. (End Purpose – *'yeast of the world'* – in their immediate world." (page v)

"The great task of building the Kingdom of God...requires audacious and courageous Christians with personality, firm in their convictions and at the same time docile to the guidance of the Holy Spirit... (those who) leaven their environments with their witness of life, because they are fully convinced that it is more important "to be" than "to do." (page vi)

"The Diocesan Secretariat is a group of leaders who are responsible for the proper functioning of the School of Leaders (SoL) and the whole Movement in an area. It ensures that the School fulfills what it is commissioned to in each of its essential phases of the Movement; the Precursillo, Cursillo, and Postcursillo. It ensures the unity in the message and freedom of the Cursillistas. ...The Cursillo Movement also has a SoL which is the working arm of the Secretariat. The SoL provides a place for continual growth and understanding of the Church and the Movement..." "...Both structures exist to serve the Ultreyas." (page 23-34)

"The members of the Secretariat and of the SoL are, in the diocese, jointly responsible for the planning and coordination of the Movement's activities." (page 35)

"A typical Secretariat consists of the Lay Director; the Spiritual Advisor; the chairpersons of the SoL, Precursillo, Cursillo, and Postcursillo; a secretary and a treasurer." "...the Secretariat is responsible for the correct functioning of the School, which is the working arm of the Secretariat... the Secretariat should review the work being done in the Precursillo... checks on the work in the Cursillo section... checks on the work in the Postcursillo ..." (page 68)

The Leaders' Manual is filled with vast information to assist Cursillistas on the conduct of the Cursillo Movement in the Diocese. It is an invaluable tool and resource for ALL Cursillistas, and especially for those willing to step up and continue the working of the Cursillo Movement within the Albany Diocese.

Other resources include the By-Laws and Pastoral Plan for the Cursillo Movement in the Albany Diocese.
